For nearly 40 years we have provided HIV services built on the foundation of concern for safety, education, and connection to care. We respect people for who they are and where they are, no matter what.

All the work done at the Alliance comes full circle. We wrap our arms around our clients ensuring they are never alone at any step of the way. The entire team at the Alliance is steadfast in our dedication and passion to and for the clients and communities we serve each day. 
## We're Moving!

Other times, I'm in meetings, doing reports, helping pack Harm Reduction supplies, or helping in Syringe Exchange.

#### What do you find most challenging?

Keeping clients engaged and on track in the Suboxone Program.

#### What is your proudest moment at the Alliance?

The moment when you're out in public, and you see someone you helped in the Suboxone bridge clinic working hard in public. It may sound silly, but you smile watching them smiling and interacting with others, knowing their past struggles, how far they've come, and how proud you are of them. That is as close to a proud parent moment as you can get without being a parent.

#### What advice would you give on working here?

Use the time you're given for self-health! As an older staffer, I've worked a long time and in many different places. But never where we were given so much time and told to use it. So, use it!!



Once an initial intake is complete, clients will be paired with and meet with their care coordinator to discuss their challenges and goals. Then a plan will be created to address immediate needs. Goals are reviewed by client and care coordinator to ensure they stay on track.

ourselves on providing clients with wrap around services and support at every step of their journey.

# By utilizing Health Homes as an additional resource, you are not losing a client, you are offering additional care and support.

Health Homes services are offered in Albany, Clinton, Columbia, Essex, Franklin, Fulton, Greene, Hamilton, Montgomery, Rensselaer, Saratoga, Schenectady, Schoharie, Warren and Washington Counties.

Clients do not have to change medical providers or managed care programs, and their connection with Medicaid will not change by enrolling in Health Homes.

Please be sure clients being referred are Medicaid recipients living with HIV/AIDS, chronic illnesses, substance use disorder and/or mental illness.

## Overdose Awareness Day 2023

On August 31, in honor of Overdose Awareness Day, our team was out in the community providing knowledge, resources and awareness.

In Albany we attended the Capital Region Overdose Awareness Day event at Academy Park. 33 Narcan kits were distributed, and we collaborated with multiple like-minded community organizations including HRX, Truth Pharm, Rainbow Access Initiative, Hive of Hope, and Youth Voices Matter.

Members from our Plattsburgh team attended All Ways to Recovery/MHAB Community Center in Plattsburghwherewetabled and provided information about our organization. 15 people were trained in Narcan administration and kits were distributed to all attendees. We worked in collaboration with the Champlain Valley Family Center. After the training, survivors of overdoses shared their stories.







In Hudson falls we partnered with Hope and Healing Recovery Community Outreach Center in Juckett Park. We had tabling, giveaways and Narcan training for the first hour. The second hour was a support group, followed by a candlelight vigil. This gave the community an opportunity to process their losses together, then honor the folks we have all lost.
